<p>Properties and changes of materials Children will explore reversible changes (evaporation, filtering, sieving, melting and dissolving) and be able to identify how to separate a range of solids and liquids; recognise that melting and dissolving are different processes.</p> <p>Animals, including humans Children will work scientifically by researching the gestation periods of animals and comparing them with humans; by finding out and recording the length and mass of a baby as it grows.</p>	<p>We are Bloggers Children create a media-rich blog, comment on blogs and respond to comments. We will also learn how to stay safe and be respectful to others online.</p> <p>We are Artists Children learn to use vector and turtle graphics to explore geometric art.</p>	<p>Buddhism This unit covers Buddha's teachings of: The five moral precepts; The four noble truths; The Noble Eightfold Path and Buddhist stories.</p> <p>Christian Festivals Children will learn about festivals including Advent, Christmas and the Epiphany. They will also learn that Christians believe that God is Father, Son and the Holy Ghost.</p>	<p>Ancient Benin Children learn about the Kingdom of Benin from a range of historical sources. Children find out about the characteristic features of the society and period, through historical enquiry.</p> <p>Britain’s settlement by Anglo-Saxon, Scotts and Vikings Children study about Invasions, settlements, kings and kingdoms.</p>
