Prime Minister's update on schools reopening date....



Below is part of a speech which the Prime Minister made yesterday.....

"Schools in England will not be able to reopen to all pupils after the February half-term, but could do so from 8th March".

"The date of 8th March is the earliest that we think it is sensible to set for schools to go back and obviously we hope that all schools will go back."

"I'm hopeful, but that's the earliest that we can do it and it depends on lots of things going right, and... it also depends on us all now continuing to work together to drive down the incidence of the disease through the basic methods we've used throughout this pandemic."

"There was not enough data yet to decide when to end the lockdown....."

However, the PM intends to set out a plan for how it could be eased and the criteria involved, in the final week of February. **So what does this mean for our school?**

It means that we carry on doing what we are currently doing to keep staff and children safe who are at school, and provide the best quality education we can for all children, both for the children working at home and those who are in school. We must also continue to work in partnership and just wait until the end of February to learn how the PM plans to re open schools and whether his "hope" to re-open schools is turned into reality or pushed back safely to another date.

A big hello to all the children at home. We miss you and one day we will all be together at school. I am using my DR P, are you?



Free School Meals Food vouchers.....

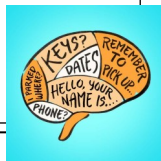
All eligible free school meals families have now received all the vouchers they are entitled to. If you have received the vouchers but they are not working, please contact our school office, we will do our best to help you.

Remote Home Learning....

As time goes on, parents and children are becoming more confident with using Google classroom. This has meant that not only can children see and speak to their class teacher, they are also able to see their friends! This has meant that we have been able to continue to educate our children, despite the challenges which the pandemic has caused. Also we have been able to respond instantly to any questions or queries children or parents may have, via Google meets or emails. To help improve the quality of the learning experience, please can parents/carers help us by doing the four key things below:-

If your child is in KS1 and EYFS, please can you supervise your child during the lessons by either sitting with them for the complete sessions or at very least, regularly check your child is behaving and engaging in the lesson. If children's behaviour becomes distracting to other children, 'time out' will be used to give children the opportunity to refocus. This means that staff will remove children from the remote learning session. When you have spoken to your child and refocused them, then they will be permitted to re - enter the session.

If your child is in KS2, please can you regularly check that your child is on task and focused. As with EYFS and KS1, 'time out' will be used to address distracting behaviour.

If you log into the lesson after it has started, please wait until the teacher has finished working with the children already in the lesson. Whilst you are waiting, please look at the work set for the lesson in the virtual classroom.

A teaching degree takes 4 long years to complete, followed by 1 year training in school! So please do not put huge additional pressure on yourself trying to achieve the same results as your child's class teacher, instead just do your best and congratulate yourself and your child for whatever achievements you have each made!

Sapphire Class.....

Inspired by the book "The Boy at the Back of the Class" by Onjali Rauf, Year 5 have been learning about the refugee crises happening all around the world and discussing the impact it has on our lives. As part of our learning, we have started writing our own refugee stories. Here is the beginning of Rezija's story.

It was dinnertime at Celia's house. Celia was living with her uncle, auntie, little cousin, her mum and her older sister Evie. They had just come from work and school.
