<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To play co-operatively, taking turns with others; to take account of one another's ideas; to show sensitivity to others' needs and feelings and to form positive relationships with adults and other children. To be confident to try new activities; to be confident to speak in a familiar group. To talk about their own and others' behaviour and its consequences, and know that some behaviour is unacceptable; to work as part of a group or class, and understand and follow the rules. 	<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To listen attentively in a range of situations. To listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond with relevant comments. To give their attention to what others say and respond appropriately. To follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. To answer 'how' and 'why' questions. To express themselves effectively, showing awareness of listeners' needs. To use past, present and future forms accurately. To develop their own narratives. 	<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements. To move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space. To handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing. To know the importance for good health of physical exercise, and a healthy diet, and talk about ways to keep healthy and safe. To manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs successfully, including dressing and going to the toilet independently. 	<p>Encourage your child to research the topics we are studying in their own time by visiting the library, museums or going on internet. Read with your children regularly and help them with their homework.</p> <p>1st half term: Healthy Eating: we will be learning about having a well-balanced diet with nutritious foods to make our bodies healthy and strong. We will also include washing our hands before eating</p> <p>2nd half term: Seaside: we will be learning about sea life, please read stories about pirates and sailors to your child. Talk about different kinds of sea animals and fish.</p>

<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach this Early Learning Goal:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To use phonic knowledge to read and write simple words and some irregular common words. To write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. <p>Over the term we will be looking at a variety of texts, including stories, information books and poetry. A selection of the texts we will be looking at are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Handa's Surprise</i> <i>Oliver's Vegetables</i> <i>Information texts about food and healthy eating</i> 	<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To count reliably with numbers from one to 20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. To add and subtract two single-digit numbers. To solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing. To talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and 2D and 3D objects and to solve problems. To recognise, create and describe patterns. 	<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members. To know about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions. Children recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. They select and use technology for particular purposes. 	<p>By the end of the School Year, children aim to reach these Early Learning Goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sing songs, make music and dance, and experiment with ways of changing them. To safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function. Use what they have learnt about media and materials in original ways, thinking about uses and purposes. To represent their own ideas through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories.
