Emerald Class...

In Emerald class (Y3/4) for our Science Topic we have been learning about 'Rocks'. The pupils observed the rocks by using their senses, then drew the different variety of rocks by using their observational skills. We also investigated three different types of rocks - slate, chalk and granite. Question: - 'Which rock is the most durable?' We tested them by hitting them together, pouring water and vinegar on them!













"My favourite thing was drawing the rocks. First we chose a rock, looked at it, then used different shadings to make

our picture." Abbey specified.
"I liked drawing the rocks because we can learn more about rocks. For example, some rocks are man-made and some are natural and have lasted a long time." Christopher explained.
"I really enjoyed doing the experiment to see if the chalk would break or not. It started to crumble in the water."

"The rocks investigation was good, because we got to see which rock was the strongest and to see whether they would survive in vinegar." Benji Commented.

Travel....

It was in the original buildings, that Charlie Chaplin first went to school. His teacher Mrs. E. E. 
If your child has or develops a food allergy however, please can you contact our school office and complete a medical form.
